A LETTER FROM PASTOR MARK WILLIAMS

Dear Messiah family,

Let me ask you an important question: why does Messiah Church exist?

To answer this question, let's consider Matthew 28:18-20, a passage known as "**The Great Commission.**"

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

In this passage we find our answer to this question: Messiah Church exists to make disciples.

What is a fully-developed follower?

A fully-developed follower of Jesus Christ is a person who lives a contagious life of faithfulness to Christ. This person has discovered his or her spiritual gifts and faithfully serves the Messiah family in an area of interest and passion. This person faithfully gives financially to the church to support God's kingdom. This person completes the circle by sharing his or her faith with others and bringing them into the church family.

I believe this is our calling together as a church, and I hope this helps you understand what I am thinking when I walk in the door each Sunday morning.

As we move forward together, let's ask ourselves this important second question:

How can we put Messiah Church in the best position possible to fulfill the Great Commission and make disciples: fully-devoted and fullydeveloped followers of Jesus Christ?

Everything we do should be driven by fulfilling this key command of Jesus.

Getting to know Jan better...

Jan, 69, is a graduate of William Penn High School, Clarion and Millersville University. A retired school teacher, Jan currently serves as the Director of Music at Messiah, where she also plays the organ, leads the Instruments of Praise, and directs the Messiah Choir. Her musical talents are remarkable, spanning a wide range of instruments including the organ, piano, percussion, saxophone, and viola. Jan's music extends beyond Messiah, as she performs with multiple bands throughout York County. She and her husband Kirk have been married for 35 years and are the proud parents of three children and five grandchildren. Their family also includes Rosie, a Cattle Dog Mix, and Precious Pumpkin, a rescue cat.

1) Jan, would you share with us your healing miracle?

The journey of healing from a brain injury is nothing short of miraculous. I went from being unable to walk, talk, feed myself, and perform minimal self-care to now fully functioning, a new normal. One of the most profound moments during my recovery involved my cat, who, upon my return home, climbed onto my head and gently placed her paw on my injury. Remarkably, she had never sat on my head before nor has she done so since. Animals are angels without wings. Also, I was diagnosed with Celiac disease and as part of my recovery I primarily eat gluten-free, vegan whole plant based foods. This has helped improve my health by eating this way.



CLAY IN THE HANDS OF THE POTTER

What would we do without the variety of containers we use every day? Plastic milk and water jugs, glass jars, plastic containers of all sorts, cotton and canvas bags, wooden and cardboard boxes, large and small. We don't think twice about what a benefit they are. But think about biblical days, especially in the Old Testament. They had one kind of container that served a multitude of purposes: clay jars. If you had a variety of different needs, you simply made or purchased a different sized clay jar or pot. Everything was clay! Whether decorative or common, they were all made of the same stuff—dirt (clay) and water.

It's no wonder the image of a potter and clay shows up so frequently in Scripture—beginning in Genesis 2:7 where "God formed man of the dust of the ground." Molded out of clay, we are, in a literal sense, pottery. God physically shaped Adam from the clay of the earth and breathed life into him. We are all humans, a word that is akin to humus, meaning "earth" or "clay." The apostle Paul referred to our bodies as "jars of clay." (2 Corinthians 4:7, NIV).

To say that we are clay in the hands of the Potter acknowledges God's handiwork as the Master Potter, or Creator, of our physical body. It also recognizes God's authority to shape us inwardly, to spiritually fashion us into a vessel fit for His use, molded as an image of our Lord Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul says God wants to form us into "a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work" (2 Timothy 2:21). This gives us a biblical basis for thinking of the events and influences of our lives as His hands and fingers, shaping us like a potter shaping clay.

In the midst of his suffering, Job reminded God, "Your hands shaped me and made me. Will you now turn and destroy me? Remember that you molded me like clay. Will you now turn me to dust again?" (Job 10:8–9, NIV) Isaiah rebuked Israel for thinking that she, the clay, knew more than God, the Potter (Isaiah 29:16; 45:9). Jeremiah lamented that Israel, "once worth their weight in gold," had reduced themselves to mere "pots of clay" (Lamentations 4:2, NIV).

Scripture's dominant theme is a simple one: God is the Divine Potter, and humanity is the clay. It is another way to express God's sovereignty over all people; a way to express our need to yield to His divine plan; a way to encourage us to find the purpose for which we have been made; a way to accept the divine purpose for all of God's handiwork.

God's Hands Form Our Life

Our life rests in God's hands. Like a skilled potter, He knows how to apply precise pressure, when to relax His grip, how to score our life with His fingernail, how to squeeze and nudge—all of which increases our fitness as a vessel for His use. At times the Master Potter places us in the kiln where the fires of life turn us into stronger vessels.

In her book Why? Anne Graham Lotz describes a phone call that launched her into "the wild blue yonder of faith." The call was from her son, Jonathan, who said, "Mom, the doctor thinks I have cancer." Anne instinctively prayed with Jonathan over the phone, and she later wrote this:

I was able to praise God for His divine purpose for Jonathan's life, which apparently included cancer. Although we had been caught by surprise, I knew God had known about it since before Jonathan was born.... Therefore I had absolute confidence that this suffering would be for Jonathan's good and God's glory. We knew God had a plan, apparently cancer was part of it!

God permitted this trial in Jonathan's life as a tool in the skillful hands of the Master Potter to mature, develop, and conform him into the image of Christ. Romans 8:28 says, "We know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." And the next verse specifies His purpose: "to be conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:29).

Our heavenly Father wants to use the events we encounter each day as tools with which to shape and sculpt us into the image of Christ. He wants to deepen our faith, to develop within us the quality of perseverance, and to make us watertight containers of *His love*, *joy*, *peace*, *patience*, *kindness*, *goodness*, *faithful*, *gentleness*, *and self-control* (Galatians 5:22–23).

When we experience pressure, we can visualize the divine Potter's skillful hands using it for good in our life. Trusting Him, we can echo the prayer of Isaiah: "But now, O Lord, You are our Father; we are the clay, and You our potter; and all we are the work of Your hand" (Isaiah 64:8).

God's Hands Re-Form Our Life

Sometimes we think we're unusable and even unredeemable. We've done something for which we feel shame and guilt, and we begin to believe God can no longer use us. Our problems are occasionally of our own making, and our pain may arise from our own stupidity. But when we bring our sin to the Lord, confess it earnestly, nail it to the cross of Christ, and surrender it to the power of His shed blood, God can take our sin and shame from us and then mold us into a vessel that glorifies Him.

But we still need your help!


There is still much work to be done here at Messiah, and we're reaching out to our Church family for support.


It's Apple Dumpling Time!

BIBLE IN A YEAR - ABOUT THE BOOKS

Micah prophesied at the same time as Isaiah and Hosea. He prophesied during the tragic and historic years surrounding the Assyrian invasion of the Northern Kingdom. Micah predicted the event in Micah 1:6, and it came to pass between 10 and 15 years later, in 722 BC. Micah's earlier prophecies concern judgment on the kingdoms of Israel and Judah for idolatry. His later prophecies concern the future kingdom that Jesus spoke of.

Habakkuk cried out to God during a very dark time in Israel. Habakkuk likely prophesied in the first five years of King Jehoiakim's reign. This king led the people into evil. The Assyrians had control of the northern kingdom (Kingdom of Israel) after a brutal invasion more than 100 years earlier. Habakkuk preached from the southern kingdom (Kingdom of Judah), which was still intact, but less than 50 years away from its own invasion by Babylon that destroyed the Temple. The pressure was on.

Colossians - The Colossian church was trying to mix Greek philosophy with Christian theology. The result was called Gnostic philosophy. Among other things, it taught that the physical world was evil and Jesus was a spirit and not a man. The book is most well-known for teaching us to be wary of false teachers.

Hebrews - This is the only book in the New Testament where scholars are unsure of its author. The author encourages the Jewish followers of Christ to endure and not return to the practices of the old Jewish covenant. It reminds the readers that Christ is superior to angels and prophets, that Christ's sacrifice is superior to Temple's sacrifices, and that Christ is superior as the Son of God.
