



A LETTER FROM PASTOR MARK WILLIAMS

Sharing the Good News!! Take a moment to read Luke 2:17-18, 20.

When my wife Kelley found out she was pregnant with our first child Matthew (Ben), she and I were so excited! We simply couldn't wait to tell our friends and family. After keeping the secret to ourselves for a short while, we shared this big news on Christmas day with the family all gathered around. There were shouts and tears and hugs all around as we all celebrated together this new life that would soon join our family. As the days passed, our parents told everyone they knew that a new grandbaby was on the way!

After the shepherds left Mary and Joseph there in the stable, Luke shares that these men began to share the news that the Messiah had been born there in Bethlehem and that they had seen Him with their own eyes. They recounted the amazing story of the visit of the angels and finding the baby time and time again.

When they had seen Him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them...The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told. Luke 2:17-18, 20 NIV

It is possible that this news was met with some amazement, and also some disbelief.

"Why would the angels tell the likes of you?"

"The Messiah born in a stable!! We doubt it!"



THE MESSIAH

Yeshua Bar Yosef



The story of Jesus' birth highlights themes of divine purpose and humble beginnings. Born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem, Judea, the town of David. Mary was engaged to Joseph, when visited by the angel Gabriel. He delivered the divine message that she had been chosen to conceive a child through the Holy Spirit, this child would be the "Son of God." Joseph, initially troubled by this revelation, was reassured in a dream and chose to stand by Mary, and raise the child as his own. Joseph followed Jewish customs by naming, circumcising, presenting him at the Temple in Jerusalem. Jesus grew up in Nazareth alongside His siblings. Jesus had a normal childhood and "grew in wisdom and stature, and favor with God and with people" (Luke 2:52).

- 1. Jesus name was Yeshua Bar Yosef (Jesus son of Joseph) Yeshua translates to Joshua in English. However, the Greek translation is lesous which translates to Jesus. After his death, he became known as Yeshua Hamashiach, (Jesus the Messiah, the Anointed One), Jesus Christ is from the Greek word Christos.
- 2. Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem, which means "House of Bread." He frequently referred to himself as the "Bread of Life" (John 6:35, 48, 51).
- 3. There is no mention of Jesus birthday or year in the Bible. He was born prior to 4 BC. We know this because Herod the Great who tried to kill Jesus died in 4 BC. Our calendar (AD) begins late because of a calculation error in the Middle Ages.



ROYALTY IN A TROUGH THE MANGER'S MESSAGE

Luke is the only writer in the Bible to use the word manger in the New Testament. And what he does with this one word — what God does with this one feeding trough — is enough to make us leap for joy. What is Luke's message through the manger?

1. The manger was dirty.

Yes, we may be sure that Joseph and Mary cleaned it up as best they could. They, no doubt, padded it in some way to make a comfy little bed. But there is no way to romanticize this bed into anything other than a feeding trough for slobbering animals. The first bed for the Son of God was not a royal cradle. It was a common feeding trough. It's meant to hold scraps to be eaten.

2. The manger was planned.

At first, you might think it was a fluke of fate — a random misfortune. Because Luke says Mary "laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." (Luke 2:7) But the way Luke tells the story, that won't work.

God had centuries to get ready for this birth. The prophet Micah lived seven hundred years before the birth of Jesus and prophesied that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem.

So, God had a good seven centuries (and more!) to plan the details of the incarnation and arrange the arrival of his Son in the right place, at the right time, and in the right way. For example, he could have easily arranged that a faithful virgin and a just man, in the lineage of David, be found in Bethlehem in accord with the prophecy. But instead, he chooses Mary and Joseph, who lived in Nazareth, not Bethlehem. And he plans for Mary to get pregnant far from the prophesied town.

To solve that problem — which God himself had created — God could have arranged to get Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem by some personal means, say a relative who needed them urgently or a dream or some private legal or business matter. But he didn't do it that way.

Instead, God moved Joseph and Mary from Nazareth to Bethlehem by means of an empire-wide census. In other words, God arranged that the most powerful leader in the world would order everyone in the empire to go to the town of their origin to register. You might call this providential overkill. He's making a point: "You think you know what I am doing globally? You have no idea. I'm putting things in place exactly as I please. Including the birth of my Son."

In view of that, it becomes ludicrous to think that a God who wields an empire to move one woman from Nazareth to Bethlehem can't arrange for there to be an available guest room. Planning a bed for his Son was easier than planning a global census. Jesus was lying in exactly the place God planned: a feeding trough.

3. The manger was a sign.

The angel of the Lord said something to the shepherds that was almost too good to be true.

Unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. (Luke 2:11)

To believe this and bear witness, they would need a sign. The angel gave it: And this will be a sign for you. you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger. (Luke 2:12)

Swaddling cloths? Every baby in Bethlehem was wearing swaddling cloths. That is not the sign. The sign is the manger. In fact, this must have sounded so wildly scandalous, the shepherds probably did not think they heard the angel correctly. This Savior, Christ, and Lord is lying in a what?

This is the sign. No other king anywhere in the world was lying in a feeding trough. Find him, and you find the King of kings.

4. The manger was glorious.

Suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest!" (Luke 2:13–14) Glory to God! The Savior is in a feeding trough! "Glory to God in the highest!" From the highest to the lowest! What a God!

5. The manger is the way of discipleship.

The angel of the Lord came to shepherds, not Pharisees.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased! (Luke 2.14)

Not the wise. Not the understanding. But the children. The ones who would take no offense at a baby in a feeding trough. The ones that would expect no better bed than their Savior:

As they were going along the road, someone said to Jesus, "I will follow you wherever you go." And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." (Luke 9:57–58)

Except for a manger. Follow me.

6. The manger was step one on the Calvary road.

The Calvary road is downhill. Not because it gets easier, but because it gets lower. The Savior's life starts low and ends lower.

Though he was in the form of God, he did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant [starting his life lower than servants — in a feeding trough]...he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. (Philippians 2:6-8)


This is how the Savior saves. This is how the Messiah fulfills all the promises. This is how the Lord reigns: from infinite deity, to feeding trough, to final torments on the cross.

We must follow him! "Any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:33). It is a lowly road. A hard road. But there is no greater joy than to be on this road with this Savior.

"Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy."
(Luke 2:10) This is no moderate joy. This is Great Joy.
"Glory to God in the highest." (Luke 2:10–14)
Great joy to us. Great glory to God.

THE MESSIAH

Yeshua Hamashiach



Jesus' ministry began when He was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River at age 30. This event signified the start of His mission to preach about the Kingdom of God. Following John's imprisonment, Jesus returned to Galilee, where He began recruiting His disciples and delivering a powerful message of repentance and divine love. Teaching in synagogues and performing miraculous healings, Jesus quickly garnered widespread attention. His growing influence led to opposition from religious leaders, ultimately culminating in His crucifixion at the age of 33. However, His story did not end there; three days after His death, Jesus rose from the grave, symbolizing victory over death and hope and redemption for believers, offering the promise of eternal life to those who embrace Him.

- 1. Jesus was baptized to fulfill all righteousness and to publicly identify with humanity's sin, setting an example of obedience and humility.
- 2. Jesus' ministry was notably supported by women who provided for Him out of their own resources. He also showed profound respect for women, including them in His teachings and parables.
- 3. Jesus was both fully God and fully human. He displayed a range of emotions during His time on earth, such as weeping at Lazarus' tomb, showing compassion for the sick and needy, expressing righteous anger when He cleansed the temple, and being anxious over His death when praying in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Through His birth, life, death, and resurrection the story of Jesus is the greatest story ever told!


MAKE A DONATION TO HEIFFER INTERNATIONAL.





New Year's Resolutions

It's that time of the year again to make New Year's resolutions. Do you make a resolution only to give up in a few weeks? As the New Year approaches, many of us will set resolutions related to weight, exercise, and finances. By incorporating biblical principles into these goals, we can enrich our lives with purpose and fulfillment in the coming year.

Lose weight. After eating all those holiday season meals, many people resolve to start the New Year off by losing a few pounds. While losing weight may improve one's health, the Bible speaks of losing "weight" that will improve one's spiritual well-being. Consider Hebrews 12:1: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us." In this passage, the Christian life is depicted as a race. One who is running in a footrace would not want any extra weight that might hinder his performance. Likewise, the Christian who is running the Christian race must lay aside anything that might hinder his progress for the Lord. Even good wholesome things can become "weights" that hinder one from living the Christian life. A job, recreational activities, pursuing an education, the love of money, or some sin may become a "weight" in our lives.

Exercise. "Have nothing to do with godless myths and old wives' tales; rather, train yourself to be godly. For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come." (1 Timothy 4:7-8). A regular exercise routine profits the body a "little," but a spiritual workout in Godly living will profit your soul, your family, your friends, and your work associates.

Save Money. Having blown the budget during the Christmas season, many of us will resolve to spend less and save more as we begin the New Year. This will surely put dollars in the bank, but the Lord spoke about how we can deposit money in heaven: "But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:20-21). To the rich young ruler Jesus answered, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." (Matthew 19:21). By giving to the Lord's cause and to those who are in need, we actually "save" ("lay up") treasures in heaven. It would be impossible for us to out-give the Lord. He has richly blessed our lives, and we should give back to Him.

BIBLE IN A YEAR - ABOUT THE BOOKS

In the last decade of the first century, the apostle John moved to Ephesus to pastor the church founded by Paul. Near the end of his life, John wrote three important parts of the New Testament—first, the Gospel of John, the book of Revelation while he was imprisoned on the island of Patmos, and then, back in Ephesus, he wrote three final letters to the Christian community. He died soon after, around 100 A.D., and was buried in Ephesus.

1 John was written to combat false teachings called "Gnosticism." Gnostics taught that Jesus was a spirit and never really had a body, and other errors. In **2 John**, he is addressing the same issue as before, but not in as much detail. The tone suggests that John is writing a letter to someone who wrote to him first. **3 John** criticized a teacher in this very brief letter. He even called him by name-Diotrephes. He accused the man of having a big ego and being a troublemaker. The letter shows us that even when the church was less than 50 years old, it had the same types of problems we have today.

Revelation is primarily prophetic. It begins with the revelation of the glorified Christ. Then the whole story of the church is given. Then, at the end of chapter 3, the church goes to heaven and we see it, not as the church anymore, but as the bride which will come to the earth with Christ when He comes to establish His Kingdom—that thousand-year reign, John will tell us more about. It will be a time of testing, for at the end of that period Satan will be released for a brief season. Then the final rebellion is put down and eternity begins. This is the viewpoint of Revelation we will now explore. History testifies that we have been looking for Christ to come again ever since He left.

Revelation is not a difficult book. Some try to make it symbolic and hard to understand. Revelation begins when Jesus Christ leaves the earth. In chapter 1, we see Him glorified. In chapters 2–3 we see the church. In chapters 4–5 we see the church in heaven. Then on earth, the Great Tribulation takes place, chapters 6–18. In chapter 19 we see Jesus Christ return to the earth and establish His Kingdom. Chapter 20 talks about the thousand-year reign of Christ. Then the Great White Throne is set up when the lost are judged, and in chapters 21–22 eternity begins. That is Revelation.
